Cervantes Field Day

10 – 11 July 2010

The first Official Field Day for the “Beachcombers”

A big discussion was had about the rules of the length competition.

Points per centimeter or points per fish?

We finally came to a decision, to make this simple , we are going to mark points per centimeter

0 category will receive 1 point per centimeters, (blowfish, stingray etc)

1 category will receive 2 points per centimeters, (low risk)

2 category will receive 5 points centimeters & (medium risk)

3 category will receive 10 points centimeters (high risk)

Length comp forms handed around by Mark.

Vix asked if fish undersize, will be measured?

All fish caught, no matter what size will be measured,, whether you keep it or release it.

Ian Cook and Mark Hansen are trialling a spreadsheet for length comp.

It was decided that for the next 6 months we will trial the **0 to3 category** and see how it goes

Make sure whatever fish that is taken home from a field day is legal size.

Cervantes is a good venue close to Perth

It is a nice easy drive of about 4 hours north of Perth. Drive up the Brand Hwy approx 190 km and turn onto the sign posted road to Cervantes. 2.5 km out of Cervantes turn right onto Indian Ocean Drive. Go north for 6.5 km and turn down Marine Drive on the north side of the new subdivision. Drive down the tar/limestone road till you reach the car park.

Cervantes is a good venue for fishing as there is a good variety of fish normally caught. The main species are Taylor, Herring, Tarwhine, Skipjack Trevally, Gardies. Night time fishing can lead to adrenalin rushes which could be a Mulloway, Shark or a lowly big Sting Ray. The area is sheltered from the big ocean swells by offshore reefs so it is calm waters. Depending on the time of year you can experience very strong winds.

Fishing Locations

When driving up the beach from Cervantes the 1st headland is Black Peak. This has some good water on the west and north sides. A couple of k's north is Black Rock. This has been a favorite location for some years. There is a platform reef on the west/north west side which provides access to deepish water. This can be fished in adverse conditions with some shelter from southerly winds. There are some camping spots tucked in behind the rock. See photograph.

A short distance south of the car park is an access track onto the beach. There is a cleared area on the left of this access track which will accommodate a couple camps. There is usually slightly deeper water front of this area with a gutter running offshore through the seagrass beds.

Hill River mouth can be very productive if the river bar has broken or the river water is percolating through the beach sand. Warning the river bar can be very soft so check for wheel tracks or walk it first.
