The Briefing will be held at the Troy Park Club Rooms Melville and the weigh-in will be held at the Cockburn powerboat club clubrooms.

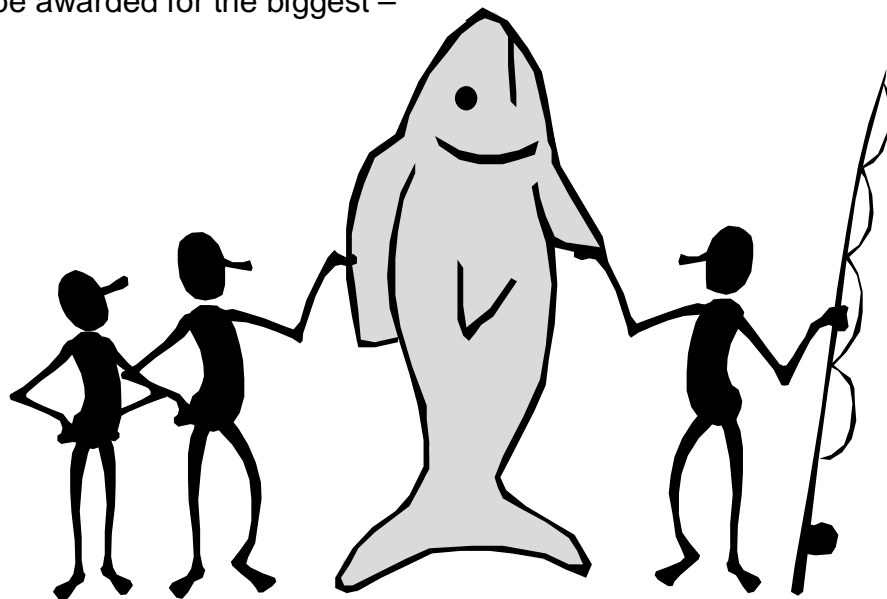

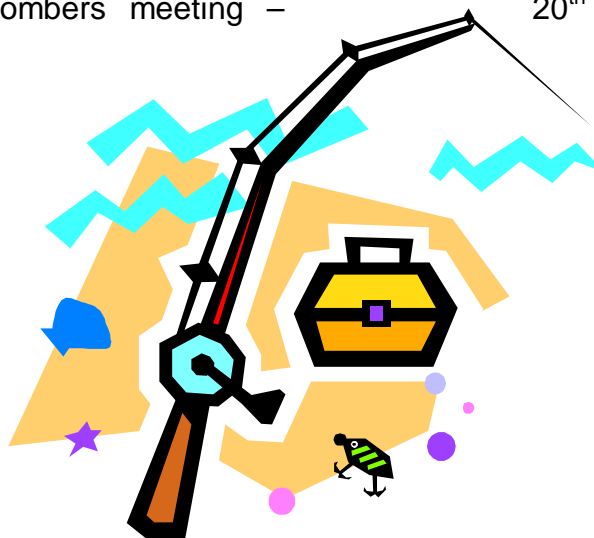

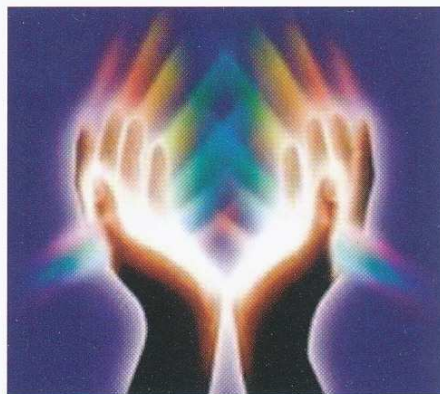
